#### **Important Dates:**

- Deadline to submit accommodation request for Fall: June 1
- Deadline to submit accommodation request for Spring: December 1
- Deadline to submit accommodation request for Summer: 6 weeks before start of term

# **Parking & Transportation**

# **Veteran-Specific Plates**

Any UM student with a Disabled Veteran or Purple Heart Combat Wounded Veteran license plate will be granted a University parking permit at no cost. The permit will be granted for a parking zone based on current availability and will be held to all regular parking restrictions. The permit can be purchased at the Office of Parking and

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Transportation, where plate and vehicle registration will be verified prior to approval of permit.
